



Natural Disasters

Snow or Ice Storm

Administration will utilize the inclement weather policy that is followed by the Little Rock School District.

Tornado

When a warning is issued by sirens or other means, seek inside shelter.

- Small interior rooms on the lowest floor and without windows,
- Hallways on the lowest floor away from doors and windows, and
- Rooms constructed with reinforced concrete, brick, or block with no windows.
- Stay away from outside walls and windows.
- Use arms to protect head and neck.
- Remain sheltered until the tornado threat is announced to be over.

Students, faculty and clients should take shelter in the following locations:

- Dispensary (students located in the classrooms)
- Women's restroom (students and clients located on clinical floor)
- Men's restroom (students and clients located on clinical floor)

Earthquake

- Stay calm and await instructions from the Emergency Coordinator or the designated official.
- Keep away from overhead fixtures, windows, filing cabinets, and electrical power.
- Assist people with disabilities in finding a safe place.

- Evacuate as instructed by the Emergency Coordinator and/or the designated official.

Floods

Floods may be caused by domestic water systems or by rivers and/or streams overflowing their banks. Floods caused by overflow of rivers and streams are extremely dangerous and may require the evacuation of buildings.

Immediate Action

For floods caused by a domestic water system failure:

- Report the incident to administration
- Protect institution property from damage where possible.
- Administration will coordinate repair & recovery.

For floods caused by rivers and/or streams overflowing their banks:

- Administration will manage protective measures when flood damage is present.
- Local news will be monitored regarding the river level.
- If flood is imminent, administration will move property for its protection.
- Students and administration should be prepared to evacuate if advised to do local emergency services
